Silly Week

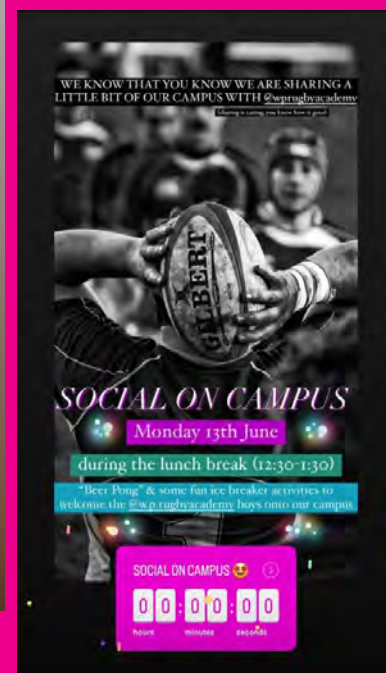
The first week of semester 1A was declared as the 'Silly Week'. Every day the students had a theme to dress up in different silly outfits on campus.
